Synopsis

Good morning. Broad HIGH PRESSURE currently spans across New England to the Canadian Maritimes. Through this evening, the broad ridge will shift SE'ward and further weaken, as a COLD FRONT gradually tracks behind from Quebec and the Great Lakes region. The pressure gradient between the broad ridge and approaching front will strengthen, yielding to stronger varying SW'ly winds to fill in by tomorrow morning. The COLD FRONT is expected to pass over the New England coast by tomorrow evening.

Current Conditions

The radar is free of precipitation this morning and satellite imagery suggests partly cloudy skies for Nantucket. The Nantucket airport as of 0700 was reporting calm wind with a temperature of 69 degrees and visibility greater than 10nm. The Nantucket Island buoy was reporting wind WNW 2kts gusting to 04kts and the Nantucket Sound buoy was reporting winds NW 06kts and gusting to 08kts with a 1ft wave height.

Severe Weather

There are no watches/warnings/advisories at this time and there is little chance for any severe weather today or tomorrow. Please monitor NOAA All Hazards Radio on your VHF for the latest official warnings and advisories from The National Weather Service.

Hedge Forecast

The pattern through today remains with HIGH confidence given the broad ridge in place, though the largest uncertainty for tomorrow lies within the exact timing of the building wind gusts and how severe squalls will be across Nantucket Sound. We currently anticipate a good likelihood of a few heavy squalls tomorrow night before midnight, though could trend weaker across the region with only modest showers to be encountered.

Conclusions

Throughout today, broad HIGH PRESSURE will tend to keep conditions generally light with occasional breezes just above 10kts, and will be accompanied by mostly clear skies. As the front approaches closer through tomorrow morning, winds from the SW will become gustier and will likely encounter a line of squalls near 2000-2200LT tomorrow night. Squall activity appears to generally start weakening as it reaches Cape Cod Bay, tracking SSE'ward over Nantucket Sound with potential sever isolated activity. As the front passes offshore during the overnight hours into the 18th, activity will look to continue breaking down.






